My Kid is Not Crazy: A Search for Hope in the Face of Misdiagnoses is an award-winning documentary film by Emmy-nominated director Tim Sorel about the post-infectious autoimmune encephalitis condition known as Pediatric Acute-Onset Neuropsychiatric Syndrome (PANS) and Pediatric Autoimmune Neuropsychiatric Disorders Associated with Streptococcal Infections (PANDAS). 
